CALL 911 FOR EMERGENCIES SHERIFF, FIRE, AMBULANCE, COAST GUARD

PLEASE DO NOT CALL PEBBLE BEACH COMPANY SECURITY IN AN EMERGENCY. Sometimes the additional time required for Pebble Beach Security to investigate or even to routinely relay the call to 911 can be critical when fire, health, or safety are involved. The importance of dialing 911 in an emergency cannot be overstated. Don't hesitate to call 911 even if an emergency is only suspected. Conversely, do not call 911 for information queries to satisfy one's curiosity.

If you need to seek immediate personal shelter from crime, officers are available at the County facility at 1200 Aguajito Rd. just east of Hwy 1 near the Monterey Peninsula College, the Pacific Grove police station at 580 Pine near Forest, the Monterey police station at 366 Madison near Pacific, and the Carmel police station on Junipero between 4th and 5th.

The 911 system is a centralized emergency dispatch and communication system operated by Monterey County Communications Department with centers located in the Salinas and Monterey Courthouses. The 911 system of Monterey County was the first one organized in the State of California. All public and private agencies involved in emergency services are linked in the 911 system.

When you dial 911, please be ready to give the dispatcher certain basic information:

- **LOCATION of the EMERGENCY**
- **NEARBY CROSS STREETS**
- **NEARBY LANDMARKS (houses, fences, etc.)**
- **NATURE of the EMERGENCY**
- **TELEPHONE CALLBACK NUMBER**
- **YOUR NAME**
- **STAY ON THE LINE — DO NOT HANG UP UNTIL THE 911 DISPATCHER TELLS YOU THEY HAVE ALL THE INFORMATION THEY NEED.**

Feel free to also report any and all crime to Pebble Beach Security, however it is imperative that crime be reported to the Sheriff's Office first.

Don't forget that if you call 911 from a "landline" at your home the dispatcher at the County Communications Center will know where you are calling from. If you call 911 from a cell (mobile) phone the CHP dispatcher will obtain your personal information and your location and direct your call to the appropriate agency.

If you can, get a suspect description: male or female; hair color; eye color; ethnic description; facial hair; height/weight and age; clothing description; anything else such as marks, scars, tattoos, accents. Get a vehicle description: license plate; color; year; make/model; body style; dented fenders, etc.; and direction of travel.

The best way to combat crime is to take basic precautions at your home, with your neighbors and on your street. Neighborhood watch groups are effective. Lock your doors! Burglar alarms are good; please set them! Don't leave things out that would invite thievery such as when you have service people in your home. Be sure to lock your cars and set the security system when you depart. When shopping don't leave a purse or other personal property in a cart that is unattended. While walking guard against pick-pockets and "purse snatch robbers."

Don't hesitate to call the current supervisor of the Sheriff's Coastal Station, Commander Tracy Brown if you have concerns regarding law enforcement in the Forest. His office number is 831-647-7675. Expect to speak to a reception person. The current CHP traffic enforcement coordinator is Pebble Beach Community Services District Deputy General Manager, Suha Kilic.
